

Basic Editing Tools

- **★ Trim:** Drag clip edges to cut unwanted start/end sections.
- ★ Split: Cut clips at a point for precise edits.
- ★ Split All: Split all layers at the current playhead.
- **★ Speed:** Adjust speed (0.1x 10x)
- * Reverse: Play video backward for a creative rewind effect.
- ★ Crop/Resize: Reframe to fit 16:9, 9:16, 1:1, etc.
- **★ Rotate/Flip:** Reorient clip for aesthetic or correction.
- **Zoom:** Apply manual or keyframe-based zoom.



INSANE TRICK Curve Speed for dynamic changes

Curve Speed lets you create dynamic speed changes, speeding up and slowing down at specific moments for cinematic timing.

How to use:

- 1. Select your clip.
- 2. Go to **Speed > Curve**.
- 3. Choose a preset (e.g., Montage, Hero, Bullet) or tap Custom to edit.

What you can do:

- Create smooth speed ramps (slow in, fast out).
- Add dramatic effects like slow motion on impact.
- Control motion timing to match music or transitions.



Text & Titles

- * Add text: Create custom text with fonts, colors, and styles.
- **★ Text templates:** Use animated presets for intros and captions.
- Auto captions: Text > Auto Captions > Spoken language (e.g., English) to auto-generate subtitles.



- 1. Duplicate the video.
- 2. Place text between the two layers.
- 3. Remove background from the top layer using: Remove Background > Auto remove.








Trending text animations

- Bounce Left
- Typewriter
- Wave In
- Blur Right
- Showing Up
- Dissolve Down

Audio Tools

- * Add music: Use CapCut's music library or upload your own.
- Voiceover: Record voice narration directly.
- ★ Sound effects: Add fun or cinematic effects.
- ★ Volume: Adjust or fade volume in/out.
- * Extract audio: Separate audio from video.




Effects & Filters

- ★ Video effects: Apply overlays like blur, fire, or sparkles.
- **Body/face effects:** Stylize faces, smooth skin, enhance features.
- **★ Filters:** Color presets to match moods (cinematic, retro, etc.)
- **★ Overlay:** Add extra clips or effects over the main video.

- Blur
- Fade In
- Rolling Film




 Sticker tracking: Makes a sticker (like an emoji or graphic) follow a moving object in your video.

Add stickers > Tracking > Select Object: Sticker follows your subject's motion.

Motion tracking (Camera): Simulates a camera following a face or object, keeping it centered.

Video > Camera Tracking > Face: Creates a face-following effect.





Keyframes let you create custom animations by setting specific points where a clip's properties (like position, scale, opacity, or rotation) change over time.

What you can animate with keyframes:


- ★ Position: Move your clip around the frame (left, right, up, down)
- **★ Scale:** Zoom in or out
- * Rotation: Add rotation for dramatic or fun transitions
- ★ Opacity: Fade elements in or out

To add keyframes:

- 1. Go to Video > Basic.
- 2. Click the **diamond icon** to add a keyframe at the start.
- 3. Move the playhead and adjust the property.

Smooth Zoom Effect

- 1. Go to Video > Basic > Position.
- 2. Move the playhead to the start → Click **Add Keyframe**.
- 3. Move the playhead to the end \rightarrow Zoom in by increasing scale.
- 4. CapCut will smoothly zoom in across the duration.





- ★ Use pre-made animated templates for professional intros.
- ★ Avoid too many text styles, stay visually consistent.
- **★** Use animated text (not static) like:
 - Typewriter
 - Showing Up
 - Bounce Left

If you're using CapCut on macOS, replace Ctrl with the Command key (\Re) for shortcuts. For example: Ctrl + B (Windows) $\rightarrow \Re$ + B (Mac) for Split
