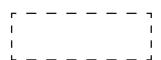

Shopify Image Requirements Basics

SUPPORTED FORMAT

JPEGGIF

Progressive JPEGHEIC

PNGWebP

Shopify automatically detects your customer's browser support and serves images in the best possible format, including modern types like **WebP** or **AVIF**, for faster loading without sacrificing quality.

RECOMMENDED IMAGE SIZES

Max file size: 20MB

Max resolution: 4472 x 4472 pixels



WHEN TO USE EACH FORMAT

JPEG (.jpg)

Best for: product photos, banners, slideshows, blog images

- Great for photos with many colors
- Small file size thanks to lossy compression
- Ideal for fast page loading

PNG (.png)

Best for: logos, icons, graphics with text or transparency

- Supports transparency
- Keeps sharp lines and text clear
- Larger file size than JPEG, but better for flat designs

GIF (.gif)

- Used for simple animations
- Automatically converted to animated WebP for better performance

WebP / AVIF

- Modern, lightweight formats
- Delivered automatically if the customer's browser supports them
- Smaller file size, faster load times

HEIC

- High-efficiency format from Apple devices
- Accepted on upload and auto-converted for compatibility

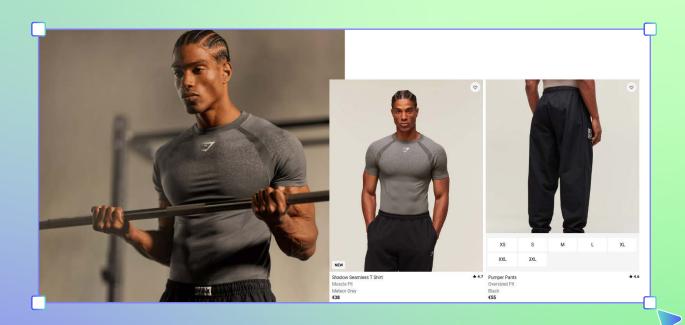
SVG

- Supported with limitations
- Cannot be resized or cropped by Shopify's transformation tools
- Not ideal for dynamic image elements

HOW SHOPIFY OPTIMIZES YOUR IMAGES

Shopify helps you deliver fast-loading images without extra effort:

- Your uploaded images aren't compressed right away, keeping them high-quality.
- When shown on your site, Shopify may compress or resize images to improve speed.
- Shopify automatically picks the best format (like WebP or AVIF) based on the visitor's browser.
- Animated GIFs are auto-converted to animated WebP for better speed.



Shopify Theme-Specific Image Recommendations

While Shopify offers general image guidelines, each theme handles images a bit differently, especially when it comes to layout, cropping, and responsiveness.



CRAVE

Best for: Mobile-first stores and bold visuals

- Slideshow & hero images: 1600 x 1050 px (landscape)
- Product images: 2048 x 2048 px (square recommended)
- Logo: Max height 100–120 px for mobile clarity

Tips:

- Crave is highly responsive and optimized for mobile, avoid placing important elements near image edges, as they may get cropped on smaller screens.
- Stick to bold, high-contrast visuals to match the theme's playful style.

DAWN

Best for: Modern stores with flexible layout blocks

Banner images: 1800 x 1000 px (1.8:1 ratio)

Product images: 2048 x 2048 px (square)

Collection images: 1024 x 1024 px

Tips:

 Dawn supports full-width and variable-height sections, so aspect ratio matters more than specific pixel sizes.

- Keep product images square to avoid awkward cropping.
- Use consistent padding or negative space in images for a clean look.

DEBUT

Best for: Simpler stores and fast setup

Slideshow images: 1200 x 600 px

Product images: 1024 x 1024 px minimum

Logo: Around 250 x 100 px

Tips:

- Debut tends to crop slideshow images vertically, use centered visuals with safe margins.
- Ensure product images are high-quality but compressed, as Debut loads them with minimal transformation.

BROOKLYN

Best for: Apparel and lifestyle stores

Slideshow: 1200 x 800 px (landscape)

Product images: 2048 x 2048 px

Logo: Max height 100 px

Tips:

- Brooklyn uses dynamic product grids and hover-zoom effects,
 maintain consistent lighting and spacing in product photos.
- Use square images for uniform display on collection pages.
- Avoid overlay text in slideshows, as layout shifts may affect readability.

NARRATIVE

Best for: Story-driven product pages and long-scroll layouts

Hero image (full screen): 1800 x 1200 px

Product images: 1400 x 1400 px or larger

Logo: 100 x 40 px for optimal placement

Tips:

- Narrative showcases large, cinematic visuals, use high-res, wide-angle shots.
- Avoid tall portrait images, which may not display well in the story sections.
- Keep background and tone consistent across long-scroll elements.
